

28 rights

The Convention contains 42 articles that outline your rights.

Articles 1 and 2 say that everyone under the age of 18 has those rights.

Here is a shorter list of 28 rights where some of the remaining articles have been grouped.

1. Right to have your best interests looked after - article 3
2. Right to parental guidance - article 5
3. Right to survival and development - article 6
4. Right to an identity - articles 7, 8
5. Right to live with, and be raised by family - articles 9, 10, 18
6. Right to express your views in matters that concern you, and for those to be respected - article 12
7. Right to access information - article 17
8. Right to privacy - article 16
9. Right to special care in some circumstances - articles 20, 21, 22, 23, 39
10. Right to health - articles 24, 25
11. Right to social security - article 26
12. Right to an adequate standard of living - article 27
13. Right to education - articles 28, 29
14. Right to preserve your own culture, language and religion as a minority - article 30
15. Right to leisure, play and culture - article 31
16. Right to a juvenile justice system - article 40
17. Freedom of expression - article 13
18. Freedom of thought, conscience and religion - article 14
19. Freedom of association - article 15
20. Protection from all forms of violence - article 19
21. Protection from kidnapping - article 11
22. Protection from child labour - article 32
23. Protection from drug abuse - article 33
24. Protection from exploitation - articles 34, 35, 36
25. Protection from harmful detention and punishment - article 37
26. Protection and care in war and armed conflicts - article 38
27. Right to benefit from any rights and legislation better than these - article 41
28. Right for those rights to be known, protected and implemented - articles 4, 42, 43-54
