

RErights Information & Consent

What is RErights.org?

RErights is a research project conducted by Western Sydney University (Australia) in partnership with UNICEF's Digitally Connected and Voices of Youth initiatives. The project explores young people's understanding of how their rights are related to digital technologies (e.g., computers, internet, television, radio, cameras etc.).

If your child takes part in the project, they will complete a series of activities (including doing surveys, making drawings or taking photos or videos) about different topics - for example, accessing and using technology, human rights, or privacy.

Activities can be completed either on paper or online, depending on how your child's teacher organises them.

What happens to my child's personal information and content they create?

RErights will not ask for your child's full name. Your child will be asked to supply their first name or a nickname of their choice, age, gender and country. If they would like more information about RErights they will also be able to supply their email address (supplying an email address is optional).

The RErights team is committed to maintaining your child's privacy. Some personal information (country, age and gender) may be published but will not allow

identifying your child. Email addresses, if provided, will not be published and will not be shared with other organisations. The RErights team will take measures to ensure your child's personal information is protected and is not accessible by third parties.

The content that your child creates (e.g., survey answers, text, drawings, photos) while completing activities will be sent to the RErights team in Australia and may be used by the research team to create new materials for sharing on the RErights website, or our partners' websites and social media channels; or may be included in our research outputs (e.g., reports, presentations or publications, in print or online).

Can my child withdraw from the project?

Yes. Your child can withdraw from the research at any time and for any reason. To withdraw, you or your child should let their teacher know they would no longer like to take part. Please note that it may not be possible to delete all content your child has provided if it has already been aggregated and published by the RErights research team.
