

What is involved in running a workshop?

To complete workshops online, you will need:

- at least one computer, tablet or phone
- an internet connection

1. check RErights.org to familiarise yourself with the project and the various topics we work on
2. get a group of young people together and talk to them about the project
3. get consent from participants and parents/guardians
4. ask young people to sign up
5. accept your first Mission and get started!

What is RErights.org?

RErights.org invites young people aged 12-18 to complete a series of activities about their rights in the digital age. RErights activities can be completed online or offline, and individually or in groups. The information we collect is then summarised and shared with the community, including with people who work on and make decisions about young people's rights.

RErights is a collaboration between Western Sydney University and the Young and Well Cooperative Research Centre (Australia), in partnership with Digitally Connected and UNICEF's Voices of Youth.

Operations & Missions

RErights activities are called 'Missions', and Missions are grouped into 'Operations' about a specific theme (for example: education, privacy, news, positive and negative impacts of technology, and many more).

There are over 30 Missions to choose from. Some are quick surveys that only take a few minutes, while others are more involved and so need more time to complete. We also have a few creative Missions where young people are invited to take photos, a short video, to do an interview, a drawing, etc.

Talk to your group about RErights

Explain that RErights is a research project. RErights will summarise young people's ideas on the impacts of technology on their rights and bring them to the attention of decision makers.

Sign up

Ask members of your group to create their own individual RErights profiles at: www.rerights.org/signup. They can then track their progress through their profile pages.

Get started

Browse Operations and Missions, choose the ones you want your group to complete, or the ones your group's most interested in. Remember, Operations and Missions can be completed in any order. Feel free to decide on a mode of participation that is best suited to your circumstances.

- Group members can complete every Mission individually
- Members can complete Missions cooperatively
- Members can complete some Missions cooperatively and others individually

What participants will be doing when completing Missions:

- Telling us how they use digital technology
- Discussing how technology affects young people's rights
- Learning and thinking about the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child
